

A Message from Pastor Barnett



This is my first "pastor's column" for our newly revised/renewed newsletter, "The Voice." We're trying to update it a bit by making it more frequent (six times a year versus the previous four) and more attuned to our seasons of parish life here at St. Luke's.

I believe that by this time, most of our members wherever they/you may be, are aware that I'm the new pastor here having arrived on sight on the 28th of July and being formally Installed on the 20th of October, both of 2024. I've enjoyed my first months here as hectic as they were. The toughest, unexpected issue that I had to deal with was the resignation of our previous secretary and the hiring of a new one. (I believe Rita has an article in this issue introducing herself.) Now that things are re-steadying in the office, I can turn my attention to the more bread and butter issues of my ministry which is, namely...: YOU.

I really won't "know" St. Luke's until I've met the people who make up St. Luke's. I started by passing around a clipboard and asking for names and cell numbers of people

who attend the 8:30 liturgy. I'll be starting to call people up and ask to meet to sit down for a cup of coffee and conversation. This will allow myself to know you better and vice versa. Please let's not wait until a tragedy like a funeral or unexpected hospitalization occurs. Getting to know people in a casual and relaxed atmosphere really helps me in my work as your pastor. I'm not saying that there's any specific thing that I get out of these meetings, rather there's a sense of the Holy Spirit leading me in a general way to know who you are.

In Luke 10, Jesus sends out the 72. He tells them to enter into houses and visit with them there, perhaps have a meal. He says to greet the house with His Peace. Now, I don't necessarily need to come to your house and you definitely don't have to feed me. However, I believe that Jesus' words here are helpful indicators about visiting and getting to know people in the Congregation.

May God grant us a wonderful 2025 here at St. Luke's! Great to be with you.


A Very SPECIAL Year!!

Also during the first week of Decem-


