A Message from Pastor Barnett



Amidst the constant flux of our society, the Christian Church often appears somewhat uncertain or divided. While it's difficult to pinpoint exactly when this began, I believe it started in the early to mid-20th century. A subtle—sometimes overt—message from the wider culture encouraged churches to adopt societal values and political stances. The idea was that aligning with popular culture would foster growth and attract more members, much like corporations of that era worked to expand their market share. As a result, today's religious landscape offers diverse options for individuals, often reflecting their specific cultural and political preferences.

Standing at the heart of our community is St. Luke's Church. Throughout the years, we've remained a local, family-oriented church dedicated to serving our neighbors. We embrace a "broad church" approach, welcoming people from all walks of life. While there is a strong sense of continuity in who we are, both Farmingdale and St. Luke's have evolved over time. Even if you've been part of this congregation for many years, you too have experienced change. It's an inherent part of God's design for us—to grow, adapt, and walk forward together.

What has NOT changed is St. Luke's fundamental commitment to be that local TRADITIONAL church. By that I mean that we emphasize the continuity of core doctrines, liturgical practices, and historical roots that

have shaped the faith over centuries. This deep connection to tradition provides us a sense of stability, reverence, and identity.

Many may believe they're searching for a quick spiritual fix or something to fulfill their spiritual sweet tooth, but what they genuinely seek is what the church has always provided: the true God revealed in Jesus Christ, who sends the Holy Spirit to build a genuine community of real people. Authentic people—sinners in need of Jesus's grace—coming together in flesh and blood. This is a true community rooted in reality, not a virtual illusion or a superficial facade.

This is the legacy of St. Luke's. I want to build more on this attribute. I hope you do too.




